Park attendants will be on duty this summer according to the schedule below. Restrooms are available.

No public phones are available at any parks.

Please note Wading Pool Use Policies:

- **All Patrons must have a 2017 Wading Pool Pass OR Daily Ticket to enter the pool area. The cost for Residents living within Robbinsdale City Limits (6/1 to 8/20) is \$35/family. For any guests of residents or any non-residents, the fee is \$30.00 for a 2017 Punch Pass which is good for 10 individual youth uses or \$5.00 for an individual youth daily ticket.** Passes and tickets may be obtained in person, Monday-Friday between 10 am and 3:30 pm or by mail: Robbinsdale City Hall, 4100 Lakeview Ave. No, Robbinsdale, MN 55422. To purchase by phone with a credit card (cannot accept AMEX), please call 763-531-1278 between the hours of 10 am and 3:30 pm. *\$5.00 individual youth daily tickets may also be purchased at the Police & Fire Safety Bldg., 4101 Hubbard Ave. No., Monday-Friday, 1:00-7:00pm, cash or check only.*
- Rules are posted on the fence and will be enforced by staff. *The parent, guardian or babysitter over 15 years old is responsible for the safety of the children with them and therefore need to provide supervision and remain in the pool area while the children are in the pool.*
- There are **NO** lifeguards on duty at the pool. The attendants/leaders at the wading pool are there to monitor use and take care of City property **ONLY**.
- Attendants may limit use of the pool if youth are unsupervised or for any infractions of the rules. *All participants must follow the posted rules and/or rules stated by the playground leader/attendant.*
- Pool will be closed if the temperature is 68 degrees or below.
- The schedule may be adjusted due to weather conditions and usage patterns.
- Health Department requires that the gate remain closed.
- If someone uses the wading pool as a bathroom, pool **must be cleared and closed for at least 12 hours.**
- No food or glass containers allowed inside the fenced in area.
- **No flotation devices except for water wings and US Coast Guard approved life jackets-Parent must be within arm reach of child at all times.**
- **Floating toys**, if large enough to use as a floatation device, are not allowed. Beach balls are allowed as long as one doesn't try to float on it and it doesn't disturb others; small toys are allowed as long as they don't disturb others.
- With a small group (under 10 youth), games may be allowed, but **must stop** when directed by staff.
- Time outs may be used by staff. If time outs do not work, participant will be denied use of the facilities for the rest of day.
- No snorkels or fins allowed. Our pool is not deep enough for this.
- Any small throwing objects-such as balls or Frisbees, must be under control so that playing catch does not interfere with any other patrons.
- No jumping off the higher block around the edge of the pool.
- No one should sit on or near the drain as this could lead to injuries.
- Wading Pool Hours are dependent on weather conditions and/or usage.

Please Note:

Due to its deteriorating condition and low number of users the last several years, the Triangle Park wading pool will permanently close after the 2017 season.

This wading pool has been in use since the 1960s and has been open during the months of June thru mid-August for over 50 years. Though the city has received good long term use of this recreation facility, we are required to spend increasing amounts of funds on repair, maintenance and bringing the pool into compliance with current codes. Over recent years, other outdoor water play facilities have been built, such as the Crystal Cove Aquatic Center in nearby Crystal, giving users additional options for outdoor water play.

The plan is to physically remove the Triangle Park wading pool in the fall of this year or spring of 2018.

The decision regarding use of this space once the wading pool has been removed has not yet been determined. Availability of funds and community interests are essential elements in the decision making process. For the interim period between pool closure and redevelopment, the structure will be removed and the area will be converted into a grass open space. The City Council, with input from city staff and Parks, Recreation and Forestry Commissioners, will be further evaluating options that best meet the recreational needs of the neighborhood.
