

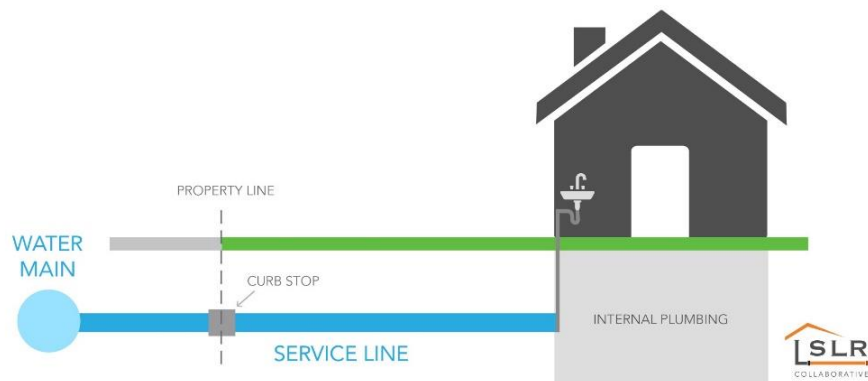
## Water Service Line Inventory Accessibility Notice

Following the adverse health consequences of lead in water pipes found in Flint Michigan, the US Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) has introduced new rules to eliminate lead drinking water pipes throughout the country within 10 years.

As a first step toward achieving this goal, all Public Water Systems (PWS) have been required to develop an inventory of lead pipes within their jurisdiction.

The water mains within the City of Robbinsdale are cast iron, ductile iron or watermain grade PVC. The City has no lead water mains. The City also tests for lead in the drinking water on a regular basis and report the results in our Annual Drinking Water Report. The Report can be found on the City's website.

The City has also completed and submitted our service line materials inventory to the Minnesota Department of Health. The water service line that connects the City water main to your home. This pipe is owned by the property owner. The diagram below is a basic schematic layout of your water service line and the water main.



The service line inventory is publicly available and you can check the materials for your service line by visiting the Lead Inventory Tracking Tool (LITT) at <https://maps.umn.edu/LSL/> .

To complete the service line inventory our system information was collected as new water meters were being installed as part of the recent changeout project. As of October 30,2024, our inventory contains 1 lead, 388 galvanized requiring replacement, 8 unknown material, and 4,750 non-lead service lines.

Property owners who have lead services or whose service is currently unknown have been provided information by separate mailing.
